## AM/2023/03. Report of the Parish Council Chairman


There was a report given by the outgoing chair, Cllr Donna Andrews.

## AM/2023/04. Report of the RMBC Councillor for Thurcroft & Wickersley South

Cllr Zachary Collingham on behalf of the RMBC Councillors for Thurcroft and Wickersley South, he gave an update on the progress from RMBC and the representation for Thurcroft at the borough level. He summarised the work with the road resurfacing in the village, as well as the initial outlines for the Towns and Villages project to rejuvenate the high street.

Various matters were discussed by electors. These included;

- Antisocial behaviour from motorbikes in village and what can be done to stop this from happening with how can the recreation field be sealed off from vehicles.
- Residents discussed when the next skip will be available in the village. However, there is a change in the law that is causing complications for the next skips.
- Thurcroft Cemetery and the provision of water, and a suspected tap which was clarified by an elector as a previous bowser in the cemetery.
- The Assets and land of the parish council being held in Charitable Trust for protection from being sold.
- Support for Brampton en-le Morthen and their recent petition for road safety.
- Grass cutting throughout the village is not good enough from RMBC.
- Car theft and making sure people are reporting crime.
- Attendance to the centennial event at Laughton en-le Morthen for the 100<sup>th</sup> year of the War Memorial.
